# Human Rights, Biodiversity and SDGs Weaving together SDG 16 and the human right to a healthy environment into the post-2020 global biodiversity framework

This event aims to raise awareness and build partnerships in the CBD process and with CBD Parties about the interlinkages between human rights and biodiversity and why recognising and implementing human rights is key not only for implementing the CBD and achieving the Strategic Plan 2011-2020 but also for achieving the SDGs.

The event will provide a platform for dialogue about integrated sustainability and human-rights based approaches in the achievement of the SDGs and incorporating SDG 16 and human rights principles into the post-2020 global biodiversity framework – such as in a new dedicated target and as crosscutting dimensions. It will also discuss tools and strategies for implementing the biodiversity and ecosystem dimensions of the right to a safe, clean, healthy and sustainable environment, including in the context of key sectors (SBI Agenda Item 5 on mainstreaming biodiversity and SDG 12 on sustainable production and consumption patterns).

Key outcomes of the international peer to peer Dialogue on weaving together Sustainable Development Goal 16 and Human Rights in the Post-2020 global biodiversity framework will be presented. This Dialogue (Kenya, 28-31 May 2018) was convened by SwedBio at Stockholm Resilience Center, International Development Law Organization, UN Office of the High Commissioner of Human Rights - Special Procedures, UN Environment and Natural Justice.

Weaving together SDG16 and the human right to a healthy environment into the post-2020 global biodiversity framework

The diversity of all forms of life on our planet and healthy ecosystems providing ecosystem services, are necessary for enjoying a broad range of universal human rights and the respect for, and exercising procedural rights, such as public participation, are necessary actions for a stronger engagement of a diversity of individuals and groups for safeguarding ecosystems for present and future generations. Similarly, sustainability, biodiversity and healthy ecosystems, and human rights are cross-cutting dimensions of the 2030 Agenda, with human rights principles specifically recognized in SDG 16 on peace, justice and strong institutions.

The links between human rights and the environment are rapidly moving from the periphery to the centre of the UN's agenda as evidenced by key UN Environment Assembly and Human Rights Council resolutions, the work of the UN Special Rapporteur on human rights and the environment (Prof. John Knox), and the <u>UN Environment Environmental Rights Initiative</u> -which includes a policy on environmental defenders.

As we mark the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 2018, it is an important moment to bring the discussion about the right to a healthy environment and the role of human rights and justice in sustainable development to the CBD.
